



Employment-Oriented Aliyah Program Pharmacy Technician Ye'elim Absorption Center, Be'er Sheva | 2026-2027



Would you like to integrate into Israel's healthcare system and build a professional, stable, and meaningful career?

The Jewish Agency for Israel, the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration, Itworks Association, and Meuhedet Health Services invite Aliyah candidates and new Olim to join a unique Employment-Oriented Aliyah Program in the field of Pharmacy Technician Training. The program combines subsidized housing, Hebrew studies, employment-oriented Hebrew, professional training, and support toward successful employment integration.

Why Join the Program?

Pharmacy Technician is an important and in-demand profession within Israel's healthcare system. A pharmacy technician assists pharmacists in daily operations, patient service processes, inventory management, medication handling, prescription checks, and supporting pharmacy activities.

For new Olim, this program provides an opportunity to acquire a practical and sought-after profession, integrate into the Israeli job market, build professional and economic stability, and become part of Israel's healthcare system. The program takes place at the Ye'elim Absorption Center in Be'er Sheva and enables participants to undergo a structured absorption process in southern Israel, while connecting them with the needs of the healthcare system and employment market in the Be'er Sheva and southern region.

What does the program include?

- Subsidized housing at the Ye'elim Absorption Center in Be'er Sheva
- Hebrew studies (Ulpan) for approximately five months
- Employment-oriented and professional Hebrew – approximately 150 hours
- Professional training in Pharmacy Technician studies
- Training supervised by the Ministry of Health
- Preparation for a written final exam
- Practical internship in a pharmacy – 400 hours
- Personal and group guidance throughout the program
- Job interview preparation
- Connection with potential employers
- Assistance with employment placement at Meuhedet Health Services or additional healthcare institutions in the Be'er Sheva and southern region

About the Professional Training

The professional training will be provided by the Itworks Association through its Continuing Education Center.

The training provides participants with the knowledge and tools required to integrate into employment in pharmacies and healthcare institutions. The curriculum includes:

- Introduction to the pharmacy work environment
- Basic professional procedures
- Customer service and patient support
- Working with pharmacists and medical teams
- Basic sciences: anatomy, physiology, biology, and chemistry
- Pharmacology and clinical pharmacy
- Common diseases and medication treatments
- Logistics and risk management
- Pharmacy laws and regulations
- Medical equipment and nutritional supplements
- Soft skills and customer service
- Professional English
- Basic pharmaceutical calculations

The theoretical training includes approximately 200 academic hours and will take place over approximately 6-7 months.

Following completion of the theoretical training, participants will complete a practical internship in a pharmacy of 400 hours under the supervision of a licensed pharmacist.

At the end of the theoretical training, participants will take a written final exam.

Passing grade: 70, including 70% success in English-language questions.

The certificate will be granted after completing both stages: the theoretical training and the practical internship, as well as submitting confirmation of completion of the practical training.

Professional studies will take place twice a week during afternoon and evening hours, in a hybrid format, and in Hebrew.



Who Is the Program For?

- Aliyah candidates and new Olim from all countries worldwide
- Individuals motivated to integrate into the healthcare and pharmacy service fields
- Candidates with learning abilities, personal responsibility, and service orientation
- Candidates with 12 years of education
- Candidates with Hebrew knowledge
- Candidates with basic English reading ability
- Candidates who successfully complete the screening process, interview, and suitability assessment for the program

Exceptional cases will be reviewed individually by the program partners.

The program is limited to a maximum of 20 participants.

The program will open subject to a minimum of 12 participants.

Housing at Ye'elim Absorption Center, Be'er Sheva

Throughout the program, participants will live at the Ye'elim Absorption Center in Be'er Sheva, operated by The Jewish Agency for Israel.

Housing conditions:

- Two-room and three-room apartments
- Suitable for families with children and individuals
- Individuals will be placed in a private room within an apartment shared with two or three roommates

Housing costs:

- Two-room apartment – 1,600 NIS per month, excluding usage fees and bills
- Three-room apartment – 1,800 NIS per month, excluding usage fees and bills
- Individual room – 700 NIS per month, excluding bills

Electricity, water, and gas payments are according to actual consumption.

Hebrew Studies and Employment-Oriented Hebrew

- Hebrew Ulpan: Approximately five months, five days a week, five hours per day.

Studies will take place at the absorption center or another Jewish Agency location, according to the decision of the professional authorities.

- Employment-Oriented Hebrew: Approximately an additional month and a half, totaling approximately 150 hours, with an emphasis on professional and workplace language required for integration into the healthcare and pharmacy service fields.

Support and Employment Assistance

Throughout the program, participants will receive guidance and support from representatives of The Jewish Agency for Israel, the Ministry of Aliyah and Integration, and the Be'er Sheva Municipality regarding initial absorption processes in Israel.

Upon completion of the training, participants will receive assistance with employment placement at Meuhedet Health Fund or other healthcare institutions operating in the Be'er Sheva and southern region.

Support will include:

- Job interview preparation
- Connection with potential employers
- Guidance for successful workplace integration
- Support throughout the job search and placement process

Program Timeline

- Aliyah to Israel and joining the program: Until December 2026
- Hebrew Ulpan and Employment-Oriented Hebrew: December 2026 – June 2027
- Professional Training: July – November 2027
- Employment Placement: Starting December 2027

This is the time to acquire an in-demand profession, integrate into Israel's healthcare system, and build a stable and meaningful career!
