

I have created a custom component, named OverlayCouponInfo in the UI in Flutterflow and saved it under the folder named pages, and to the folder named AdditionalThings under that folder. I have then created a custom widget and I added the code, which uses the class name for this component, which is OverlayCouponCompWidget. After checking for errors, I got the following error for this class name- "Target of URI doesn't exist: ", followed by a name of the import I used and "Try creating the file referenced by the URI, or try using a URI for a file that does exist." after that. To fix this, I used different import statements that the code editor auto-suggested for that class, first using one import statement at a time, then using all of them at once and also tried using uppercase and lowercase letters for the names, but every time, I got the same error. I have formatted the import statements in a way that is mentioned on this answer <https://community.flutterflow.io/custom-code/post/how-to-call-another-component-within-a-custom-widget-i22gxgy4BjsCUqp>, but I also got the same error message. I have also used AI to generate import statements based on providing the error message and other information, but it either gave the same import that I used or I got the same error message for the import statements that I mentioned before.
