1. Welcome and Introductions

A. Cameron welcomed all participants to the working group meeting and introduced Christine McKenzie, Linda Parisien and Sheridan Cook. Meeting materials and recording of the session will be made available on the InfoCentral working group.

2. Content Presentation

The Infoway Team presented each of the agenda items as outlined above. The focus of this meeting was on the collaboration between Infoway and CIHI regarding the Patient Summary specifications. We examined the description and rationale for the items within the scope of PS-CA v1.1.0 DFT and CA:FeX v2.0.0 DFT, and engaged in a roundtable discussion about the scope. 3. Questions raised during the working group meeting:

How does the pan-Canadian data content framework align with international standards like the ISO 27269 IPS data model?

The ISO 27269 IPS data model is a key standard used to align and inform the content of the pan-Canadian Health Data Content Framework (p-CHDCF) and the datasets we deliver.

Will there be a public review of the pan-Canadian data content framework?

Yes, we plan to involve stakeholders through co-contributor groups with experts in data content standards and data modeling. We welcome additional co-contributors, targeted consultations, and a public review for all artifacts.

What issues arose with the use of slicing in the framework?

Slicing in FHIR is powerful for expressing conformance patterns, but its inheritance in child profiles can cause confusion and validation issues, especially in jurisdictions not using certain structured terminologies (e.g., ICD9).

What is expected from provinces and territories (PTs) in terms of feedback/approval, considering the varying abilities to analyze all data domains?

Many PTs are in a 'greenfield' state for unlocalized data domains, making them ideal for providing feedback through the framework. This approach helps in conveying requirements and thinking through the domains.

Does the PS-CA roadmap account for changes from the IPS suite of international standards?

We maintain a close relationship with the FHIR IPS working group and regularly share our findings. This ensures that Canadian perspectives are considered in updates to standards like ISO 27269. We encourage Canadian community members to provide feedback on these emerging changes, and Canada's ISO/TC215 Mirror Committee can assist in submitting comments to ISO.
