

Mission

Position

The Board of Directors will support the work of Providence School of Arts and provide servant-based leadership and strategic governance. Though the day-to-day operations are lead by the Executive Director, the dynamics between the Board and Executive Director is relational and appropriate involvement of the Board is both crucial and expected. Specific Board responsibilities include:

Leadership, governance and oversight

- Serve as a trusted advisor to the Executive Director.
- Review outcomes and metrics created by Providence School of Arts for evaluating its impact.
- Approve annual budget, audit reports, and material business decisions.
- Assist the Executive Director and other members in identifying and recruiting other Board Members.
- Serve on committees and taking on special assignments.
- Represent Providence School of Arts to funders; acting as an ambassador for the organization.

Fundraising

Providence School of Arts (PSA) Board Members will consider this organization a philanthropic priority and will make annual gifts that reflect that priority. This enables PSA to credibly solicit contributions from foundations, organizations, and individuals. PSA expects to have 100 percent of Board Members make an annual contribution that corresponds to their capacity.

Board terms/participation

Providence School of Arts Board Members will serve three-year terms to be eligible for re-appointment for two (2) additional term. Board meetings will be held monthly for a total of 10 meetings annually. Committee meetings will be held in addition to full board meetings. Standing committees include: Executive and Finance committees. Average time commitment is 4-7 hours monthly.
